




A message from the Head of Sixth Form

The primary aim of Woodrush Sixth Form is to help students with all aspects of their personal development and academic progress.

We offer students a varied range of subjects to study while they are with us. This means that students have more flexibility to opt for subjects that will maximise their chances of being successful over the two year course of study.

However, the Sixth Form experience at Woodrush is not just about studying the courses the students have opted for, we also provide an extensive range of enrichment opportunities.

The support provided to students in our Sixth Form is second to none. We have Progress Leaders designated to the Sixth Form to support students with any pastoral or curricular issues. We also operate a vertical tutoring system, where year 12s mix with year 13s, and this provides students with additional support with the subjects they are studying. Moreover, the general ethos of the school

means that students can go to their subject teachers for as much additional support and advice as they need.

We also provide a comprehensive programme of information and guidance to our students in terms of life after the Sixth Form.

Woodrush Sixth Form is currently going through an exciting phase of development. Last year saw us achieve another set of positive A-level results with 71% of all grades being A* to C. In addition to this our students acheived a 99% pass rate for their courses and this led to them being able to take up places at some of the best universities in the country.

If you are intending to continue your studies with us next year, we want to make sure you feel valued and are confident that you have the opportunity to fulfil your potential in our Sixth Form.

It is also important for us that you feel part of a community where you are happy and secure, yet inspired to get involved. Woodrush Sixth Form is a stimulating and supportive environment for you to continue your further education studies. We are already looking forward to meeting the new cohort of students intending to join us for the new academic year in September 2019 and we welcome your application.

Woodrush Sixth Form

Woodrush Sixth Form offers a comprehensive range of qualifications. Our Level 3 qualifications are routes into University and Higher Apprenticeships. A full A Level takes two years to complete and in Year 12 you will take three or four subjects.



Information, advice and guidance

In Woodrush Sixth Form students are given comprehensive advice and guidance on life after Sixth Form. This includes support with university applications, higher apprenticeships and career options.

Our Sixth Form Student Development Co-ordinator will:

- Provide drop in sessions for students requiring information and advice.
- Be available at Parents' Evenings for consultations.
- Provide information and advice about career opportunities and University applications.
- Offer one to one interviews for students identified by the Head of Sixth Form and tutors as requiring guidance regarding their choices of Higher Education courses, future employment or higher apprenticeships.
- Organise and arrange visits to University Open Days, Higher Education Conventions and career fairs.

In addition to this support, we also

- Have dedicated Progress Leaders linked to the sixth form to support and monitor students.
- Closely monitor students' progress and provide timely and prompt information to parents.
- Put in place timely interventions where students need additional support and guidance to acheive their goals.
- Run a full Sixth Form Induction Programme at the beginning of the academic year that consists of workshops designed to equip students with some of the fundamental skills required to successfully tackle Key Stage 5 study.
- Deliver workshops on study skills and revision techniques.
- Invite speakers and guests to advise on matters such as student finance and 'Oxbridge' applications (etc).



Facilities

As well as having use of the other facilities around the school, the Sixth Form Centre is a designated area in the school for the students to use recreationally and for their studies. The Sixth Form Centre consists of a Common Room and two study rooms, a Group Study Room and a Silent Study room.

The Common Room has an expansive seating area, a kitchen area and a wall mounted wide screen television.

The Group Study Room is a purpose built study area for the students to work in. There is wireless internet access in this area as well as ICT facilities for the students to use. The Study Room also has a resource library that consists of various materials to support students in applications to further education courses and other career pathways.

The Silent Study area is a new addition to the Sixth form where students can go to work independently. It is equipped with a large seating area of independent study desks along with set of computers.

In addition to this students also have access to the public library which is located in the Woodrush Community Hub as well as the on site gym.



The Sixth Form Committee

The Sixth Form Committee is an important decision making body in the Sixth Form. The Committee is comprised of several members who all have select roles, including: Head Boy, Head Girl, Deputy Head Boy, Deputy Head Girl, Charity/Fundraising Directors, Social Events Co-ordinators and Sports Directors. The Committee meets frequently throughout the course of the academic year to discuss and organise a wide range of events and initiatives for the Sixth Form.

The Committee is also important in terms of representing student voice in the Sixth Form. It is vital that the Sixth Form have their say in terms of further improvements and developments they would like to see made.

The Sixth Form Committee ensures that these views are represented and implemented where facilities, social events, trips, fundraising/charity events and other initiatives are concerned.

The Sixth Form Experience...

The Woodrush Sixth Form experience is not just about what happens in the classroom. We want to make sure that every student has a range of enrichment and personal development activities that they can participate in around the school and in the wider community.

Some of these opportunities include:

- A bespoke programme of additional academic enrichment qualifications including Asdan Award of Personal Effectiveness and the Extended project Qualification - both of which attract UCAS points
- Being part of the editorial team for the Sixth Form newsletter ('The Sixth').
- Working as a mentor for children lower down the school as well as within the sixth form.

- Organising and supporting fundraising events for charities like 'Children in Need' and 'Macmillan Cancer Support'.
- Attending University organised courses, open days and workshops.
- Completing work experience placements linked to possible career pathways.
- Numerous social outings (theatre, cinema, outdoor activity centres etc).
- Going on a range of school trips and residentials (including trips to the Houses of Parliament, the Winter Wonderland, the Clothes Show, a sightseeing tour of London and the biannual trip to New York – etc.)

Last year Woodrush Sixth Form students achieved another set of great results.

71% A* - C 99% A* - E

These results led to our students taking up places on a variety of university courses. This included a number of students gaining places at Russell Group universities (the top 24 universities in the country). Competition for places at these universities comes

from all four corners of the globe. We are therefore incredibly proud that a number of our Sixth Form graduates are now studying at prestigious universities like Birmingham, Manchester, Nottingham and Sheffield.

We also have students that decide to apply for apprenticeships and successfully gain places on very competitive courses within a range of industries such as Finance and Management, NHS and businesses such as Jaguar Land Rover.
