Woodrush Sixth Form's Careers Information, Advice and Guidance programme is delivered through timetabled Enrichment sessions each week and through the daily tutorial programme.

Support available to students includes UCAS and university application guidance, apprenticeship and employment advice, information re. accessing structured GAP year programmes and general career guidance. Careers information, advice and guidance is further supported by relevant content in the A level subject curriculum and wider opportunities available to our sixth-formers.

Within the weekly Enrichment programme students have the opportunity to

- Develop appropriate life-skills
- Undertake careers related research
- Investigate post-18 destination pathways e.g. through UCAS, apprenticeships, study abroad options, GAP year programmes etc
- Work with outside specialists in areas such as higher education, employment, apprenticeship provision, life skills development etc

During the two years of their Sixth Form study opportunities are available for all students to take part in and access:

- University talks and presentations
- Visits to Higher Education and Careers Fairs
- Taster days at universities
- Oxbridge entry guidance
- Apprenticeship seminars and workshops
- GAP year presentations
- Work placements
- Employment and work related activities and visits

- Advice and guidance sessions re. creating CVs, completing applications and interview skills
- The Career Ready programme

To support and aid the delivery of our CIAG programme we work closely with partners including Warwick University, Oxford University, Worcestershire Apprenticeship Hub, Career Ready, the National Citizen Service and Project Trust.
